## EXPLANATION OF TENDER DOCUMENTATION

The Contracting Authority of the over-threshold public contract called „**Milling and Implanting System of Contact Chip Modules and Fingerprint sensors for ID1 Cards** // *Embedovací systém kontaktních čipových modulů a snímačů otisků prstů pro ID1 karty*“ being awarded in an open procedure pursuant to Act No. 134/2016 Coll., On Public Procurement, as amended (hereinafter referred to as “Act”), hereby explains the tender documentation in accordance with Sec. 98 of the Act.

Questions about the technical specification:	
<u>Question No. 1:</u>	<u>Answer to the question No. 1:</u>
Could you provide a drawing of the fingerprint sensors and the related module tapes? Because I could not find this in your documents.	The drawing of the fingerprint sensor and the related module type is not a part of Tender Documentation. The reason for this is, that we will be open to different solutions in the best way to get a cheapest solution for the implanting. From our side is not possible to mention one type of module, which could limit the range of applicants It is up to you which fingerprint sensor application you will offer us. We also accept a module with a fingerprint reader in contact chip format. The delivery also includes the delivery of test material and a pilot project for biometric cards with an integrated fingerprint reader.
<u>Question No. 2:</u>	<u>Answer to the question No. 2:</u>
Your required throughput for the contact as well as the DI modules is too high. Therefore, we have to be offer 2 machines. Required is only one piece from you side....	The throughput is according to our yearly production capacity of plastic cards. We are looking for only 1 (one) piece of Milling and Implanting System. The main reason for this is lack of space in the production area.  If you are able to install two machines into the designated space in the production according the drawing, we can accept an offer of two pieces of machine.

<b><u>Question No. 3:</u></b>	<b><u>Answer to the question No. 3:</u></b>
The changing time to adapt the machine from contact to DI modules with 4 requested hours could a little bit to less.	The Contracting Authority states that “4 hours” is the maximum time, as specified in the technical specification (Annex No. 1a to the Draft Contract). If the time is shorter, it is for us acceptable.

**Conclusion:**

The Contracting Authority does not consider this explanation as alteration or supplementation of the tender documentation whose nature would demand extension of the time limit for the tender submission in accordance with Sec. 99 (2) of the Act, since the Contracting Authority does not alter the tender conditions.
